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Christmas Tree Permits



As the holiday season approaches, the Forest Service is once again offering an opportunity for families to obtain a Christmas tree from the Okanogan-Wenatchee National Forest. Key things to know when cutting your national forest Christmas tree:

- 1. Christmas tree permits cost \$5 each and are available at all ranger stations and the forest headquarters. The permit allows a family to cut one tree, maximum height 15 feet, or dig a live transplant tree; only two permits will be issued per household. Permits may be purchased in person or by mail. Permits are not refundable and may only be used on the Okanogan-Wenatchee National Forest.
- 2. The Christmas tree permit must be securely attached to the tree and not removed until the tree is in your home. Christmas trees cannot be harvested in Wilderness areas, campgrounds, developed recreation areas, or tree plantations.
- 3. Remember to mark or tear out the month, day and year tabs on the permit before transporting the tree from the national forest. Even though there are multiple years listed on the permit, it is good for one use only.
- 4. If parking at a Sno-Park, you must have a valid Washington State Sno-Park permit displayed on your windshield. If parking at a site that requires a Northwest Forest Pass, this pass must be displayed. Visit our website at http://www.fs.usda.gov/main/okawen/passes-permits for more information.

Some tips to help make your trip a safe one when venturing out into the cold and snowy hills in pursuit of a Christmas tree.

- 1. Before leaving home, notify a friend or family member where you will be going and when you will return.

 Then, stick to your plan and let your contact person know when you have returned.
- 2. Consider carefully your clothing and equipment needs, making certain they are adequate for the worst conditions you might encounter.
- 3. Be sure your vehicle is able to access your cutting site—we recommend using a four wheel drive high clearance vehicle with all-weather tires and carry tire chains.
- 4. Be familiar with the area that you plan to visit. Check with local Forest Service offices to ensure the route you plan to take is passable.
- 5. Carry extra clothing, food, and tools in your vehicle for those unexpected mishaps that may occur.

INTERAGENCY PASS PROGRAM (America the Beautiful National Parks & Federal Recreation Lands Pass):

This pass combines the benefits of existing recreation passes from five federal agencies into one comprehensive Interagency Pass called "America the Beautiful – National Parks and Federal Recreational Lands Pass."

- The pass covers recreation opportunities on public lands managed by National Park Service, Fish and Wildlife Service, Bureau of Land Management, Bureau of Reclamation, and U.S. Forest Service.
- The pass applies to those locations that currently have entrance or standard amenity fees.
- The annual pass sells for \$80, the lifetime senior pass is \$10, and the lifetime access pass and the
 volunteer passes are free.

- Passes are valid for one full year from the month of purchase.
- Passes provide entrance or access to the pass holder and accompanying passengers in a single, private, non-commercial vehicle at federally operated recreation sites across the country.
- Passes cover the pass holder and three (3) accompanying adults age 16 and older at sites where per person entrance fees are charged. No entry fee for children 15 and under.
- Passes are NON-REFUNDABLE, NON-TRANSFERABLE, and cannot be replaced if lost or stolen.
- This program replaces the Golden Eagle, Golden Age, and the Golden Access Passports as well as the National Parks Pass. Existing passes will remain valid until expired, lost or stolen.
- These passes can be used in lieu of the Northwest Forest Pass.

RECREATION PASS PURCHASE INFORMATION:

A \$5 day use fee is required at many trailheads and day use sites across the national forest. The Northwest Forest Day Pass, Northwest Forest Annual Pass, and America the Beautiful Interagency Annual Pass are honored at all Forest Service-operated recreation sites where a day use fee is required. OFFICE HOURS: The Chelan Ranger District office is located at 428 West Woodin Avenue in Chelan with office hours of 7:45 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday with a one hour closure for lunch from 11:30 to 12:30. The Chelan Ranger District also serves as an information center for the Lake Chelan National Recreation Area.

SNOW LEVEL: Snow has been reported at the 4,000 to 5,000 foot elevation level. Everything above that is completely covered in about 3 to 4 feet of snow. A local motorist traveling on Grade Creek Road No. 8200, at an elevation between 4,000 to 6,000 feet, reported heavy delays when his vehicle become stuck due to severe road conditions. Up to 5 feet of snow was reported. People planning to cut a

Christmas tree should be very cautious and expect to encounter snow at these elevations.

CHRISTMAS TREE PERMITS: These permits are available at the Chelan Ranger District office and at Chelan Shell Food Mart gas station at 301 East Woodin Avenue in Chelan.

ECHO RIDGE: All Echo Ridge trails are open for non-motorized use.

ROADS: Most roads above 4,000 feet are snow covered. Please check with the Chelan Ranger District office for current road conditions before traveling on forest roads.

CAMPING: There are no reservation campgrounds on the Chelan Ranger District, all are first come, first serve. There are bear proof boxes installed at Prince Creek, Moore Point, and Holden Forest Service campgrounds. Some boat-in campgrounds may be inaccessible due to lower lake level and access to some docks may be in impossible.

FIREWOOD: Permits to cut firewood for personal use are available at the Cle Elum Ranger Station and the Kittitas County Chamber of Commerce Visitor Centers in Cle Elum and Ellensburg. The minimum purchase is four cords for \$20 and a maximum of 12 cords for \$60 per household per year. A valid firewood permit must be in the woodcutter's possession when removing firewood from National Forest lands. It is not necessary to have a permit to collect campfire wood that will be burned on the National Forest.

drive through or around washouts.

Firewood collection areas are limited to the greater Buck Meadows area in the South Fork Manastash and the lower Reecer Creek area on the Cle Elum Ranger District; snag felling is not permitted. Check frequently with the ranger station for information on newly opened woodcutting areas.

ROADS: Please report road damage or other concerns to the Cle Elum Ranger Station. Please to not

- North Fork Teanaway Road No. 9737 The road has sustained numerous washouts near the Esmerelda basin and Ingalls Way trailhead. The road is closed to motorized use at Iron Peak Trail which is about a mile and a half before the Esmerelda and Ingalls Way trailhead. There is no estimated date when the road will reopen. Please do not block the road or park in front of the barriers.
- Liberty Beehive Road No. 9712 is closed below its junction with Road No. 9718 due to a washout.

TRAILS: Most trails have been maintained. Trees continued to fall throughout the summer months so travelers should be prepared to encounter blow down on the trails. Expect to encounter snow on trails above 4,000 feet elevation.

MOTORIZED TRAIL UPDATE: The motorized trails within the Table Mountain management area are now closed to motorized use until June 15, 2017. All other motorized trails are open and maintained. Snow levels are dropping. Please do not ride beyond the snow line if you encounter snow as it may cause damage to the trail.

CAMPGROUNDS: Developed campground are closed for the season. Those which are not gated can continue to be used with no fees and no services. Please pack out your trash.

The Wish Poosh boat launch at Lake Cle Elum and the Kachess Lake boat launch at Kachess campground are closed for the season.

Reservations can now be made for individual **campsites** at Kachess and Salmon La Sac Campgrounds and Cayuse Horse Camp. Go to www.recreation.gov or call 877-444-6777 to make reservations.

Reservations for **group sites** need to be made through the National Recreation Reservation Service by calling their toll free number 877-444-6777 or by going online to their web site at www.recreation.gov. CABIN RENTALS: During the winter there is just one cabin rental available on the Cle Elum Ranger District. The Teanaway Guard Station will not be available for the winter season 2016-2017, beginning November 1, 2016, due to a seasonal stream channel that has changed course and floods the toilet during the wet season. Plans are in place to relocate the toilet in the spring of 2017.

Taneum Guard Station Cabin is the only cabin rental available during the winter. It is a small four room Forest Service cabin located approximately 20 miles from Ellensburg, WA. The cabin is located on Taneum Creek in a quiet secluded area. There is a small campground just up the road, less than a quarter of a mile from the cabin. There is running water in the cabin and propane is used for lighting, cooking and operating the refrigerator and water heater. There is a fire ring and picnic table outside. CAMPGROUNDS: The Entiat River Road is gated closed at about mile post 31. Motor vehicles, motorcycles, livestock, bicycles, and foot traffic are prohibited on the road. The road is closed for public safety due to impacts from wildfires.

ROADS: Due to heavy rains in October and November be alert to unexpected washouts. Four-wheel-drive and high vehicle clearance are always recommended for travel on forest roads. If roads are muddy and your vehicle is damaging the road surface, please turn around to prevent further road damage. Remember, there is limited turn around space available on most forest roads.

Road and trail conditions can change quickly so check for current conditions and closures before you go. The best way to be prepared is to think ahead about what you would do in a potential emergency and have proper equipment and supplies with you.

Snow has accumulated at higher elevations. Expect to encounter snow at 4,000 feet elevation making Forest Service roads unpassable. Turn around to avoid being stranded.

ATVs, WATVs & SIDE BY SIDES: All Entiat Ranger District Forest Service roads and trails are closed to these vehicles.

TIPS TO SAFE DRIVING ON FOREST SERVICE ROADS:

- Drive defensively. Although most Forest Service roads are unpaved with infrequent traffic, drivers still must expect to encounter other cars and trucks, dirt bikes, hikers, equestrian riders, and logging trucks.
- Obey the rules of the road. You may be in the middle of nowhere, but the rules of the road and basic common sense still apply.
- Be careful braking on gravel roads. Give yourself more time and distance when coming to a stop.
- Keep to the right.
- Be prepared. Expect to encounter rocks and boulders, road washouts, downed trees, and other hazards.
- Recreation trails sometimes cross the road... and are not always visible. Drive slowly and be aware of other recreationists using the roadway.
- Obey road closures. Roads and trails are closed for a variety of reasons, which may include unsafe conditions or environmental reasons.

UPPER MAD RIVER SEASONAL TRAILS CLOSURE: All Upper Mad River trails are now closed. Blue Creek Trail No. 1426, Upper Mad River Trail No. 1409.1, Alder Ridge Trail No. 1523 and Upper Chikamin Trail No. 1561 are closed.

The annual seasonal closure is to protect natural resources, minimize damage to trails, and maintain quality trail systems. The seasonal closure protects trails from damage caused by wheeled and stock travel on muddy trails. **When closed, the trails are open to hikers only.** The trails will be posted open when the snow melts and the trails dry. Trails historically open in July once snow has melted off.

TRAILS: Winter conditions exist on the trails. There is accumulated snow at higher elevations, at approximately 4,000 feet, making Forest Service trails difficult to navigate. Be prepared with snowshoes, crampons, ice axe, and layered winter clothing. 45 Mile Sheep Drive	1432	The trail is temporarily closed due to hazards resulting from the Wolverine Fire. The 45 Mile Sheep Drive Trail is within Glacier Peak Wilderness. It begins at Entiat River Trail #1400 and ends at Emerald Park Trail #1230. This 4.9 mile primitive trail is not regularly maintained and not recommended for stock. It is very steep and some route finding may be required. It was burned over in the Tinpan Fire in 2006 and Wolverine Fire 2015.
Alder Ridge	1523	The seasonal trail is closed and open to hikers only. This trail provides access to Entiat Ridge and the Mad Lake area. It is maintained primarily for motorcycles and mountain bikes.
Angle Peak	1444	The trail was maintained in 2016. This trail runs from the Lake Creek Trail to Devils Backbone Trail #1448 and provides a loop opportunity via those trails. Rated MOST DIFFICULT for motorbikes.
Anthem Creek	1435	The trail was not maintained in 2016. The Anthem Creek Trail begins at Entiat River Trail #1400 and ends at Duncan Hill Trail #1434.3.3 miles long (5.3 km) This is an access trail from the Entiat Valley to the Duncan Hill area. The trail is very steep with many switchbacks. Rated MOST DIFFICULT for motorbikes.
Billy Creek	1416	The trail was maintained in 2016. This trail offers access from Mad River to Tyee Ridge. The Billy Creek Trail begins at Mad River Trail #1409 and ends at Tyee Ridge Trail #1415. This trail is in the 1994 Tyee Fire area, and frequently has trees down over the trail, so be prepared. It is steep, and there is hazardous tread on the lower part of the trail.
Billy Ridge	1413	The trail was maintained in 2016. Trail connects at Tyee Mountain Look Trail Head down to Mad River Trail #1409 at 7.5 miles long and lower portion MOST DIFFICULT for motor bikes.
Blue Creek	1426	The seasonal trail is closed and open to hikers only. This trail provides access to Two Little Lakes and many meadows. It also offers an opportunity for a loop trip along the Mad River Trail #1409.1. The area is also closed to off trail travel a quarter of a mile on each side of the trail.
Butte Creek	1440	The trail was not maintained in 2016. The trail runs from Pyramid Creek Trail #1439 to Pyramid Mountain Trail #1433. The tread is sporadic and steep and requires some route finding and is not recommended for stock. This is an old sheep drive trail that is primitive and very steep, and difficult to follow. Rated MOST DIFFICULT to hikers.
Chikamin Tie Upper	1561	The seasonal trail is closed and open only to hikers right now. The Chikamin Tie Trail is 6.2 miles long, gains 2,600 feet of elevation, and is primarily used by motorcycles and mountain bikes. It is rated a more difficult ride. The trail begins at the Chikamin Tie ORV Trailhead and proceeds to climb up briefly until it intersects with the Minnow Ridge ORV Trail #1524 and the Chikamin Creek ORV Trail #1534. The trail keeps climbing through brushy and rocky terrain, and crosses Chikamin Ridge Road/ Forest Road 6210 at about 2 miles. The trail continues to switchback up and down varying terrain for another 4.1 miles, until it ends at Upper Mad River Trail #1409.1.
Chikamin Creek	1534	The trail was maintained 2016. This ORV trail is 6.5 miles long, with an elevation gain of 1100 feet. This trail is used primarily by motorcycles and mountain bikes, and is rated a moderate ride. Combining this trail with Minnow Ridge ORV Trail #1524 makes a good loop trip. Water is easy to find, as the trail crosses several small streams, and the trail can be challenging in parts due to brush and switchbacks, until it ends at the junction of Minnow Ridge ORV Trail #1524 and Chikamin Tie ORV Trail #1561.
Chiwawa Lower	1548	The trail was maintained in 2016. The trail goes along hills above the Chiwawa Valley Road #6200. The trail is maintained primarily for motorcycles and mountain bikes and is rated as an easy ride. Trail begins at Deep Creek at the junction of Forest Roads #6100 and #6101, but the main trailhead is located across from the Goose Creek Campground on Forest Road #6100. The trail ends at the junction of the Minnow Ridge ORV Trail #1524 and the Chikamin Creek ORV Trail #1534.
Cool Creek	1431	The trail was not maintained in 2016. The Cool Creek Trail within Glacier Peak Wilderness begins at Ice Creek Trail #1405 just off Entiat River Trail #1400 west of Borealis Peak and travels 5.4 miles back to Entiat River Trail #1400. This old sheep drive trail is steep and primitive and is located in the Wilderness area. It offers spectacular scenery as the trail climbs into the Cool Creek basin, over two ridges and down into McKenzie Creek.
Cougar Ridge	1418	The trail was maintained in 2016. The Cougar Ridge Trail begins 10 miles behind gated FS road 5700. Cougar Ridge Trail ends at Tyee Ridge Trail #1415. Access to Cougar Mountain Viewpoint Trail, and summit of Cougar Mountain. The first 2 miles of the trail out of Mad River are steep with very tight switchbacks. The trail runs from Mad River Trail #1409 to the Tyee Ridge Trail #1415.
Cow Creek	1404	The trail is temporarily closed due to hazards resulting from the Wolverine Fire.
Devils Backbone	1448	The trail was maintained in 2016. This route traverses the crest of Devil's Backbone and provides outstanding viewing opportunities. Campsites with water are located at Handy Springs and Windy Camp. The trail has some steep rocky switchbacks and a few steep grades. For the most part it is an easy ride, but some sections require an experienced rider.

Emerald Park	1230	The trail is temporarily closed due to hazards resulting from the Wolverine Fire.
Four Mile Ridge	1445	The trail was not maintained in 2016. Four Mile Ridge Trail begins at Lake Creek Trail #1443 and ends at Devils Backbone Trail #1448. This trail is steep, rocky, and rated most difficult for motorcycles. Great views of the Entiat Valley.
North Fork Entiat	1437	The trail was maintained in 2016. The North Fork Entiat River Trail begins at the end of Forest Service Road 5606 and ends at Pyramid Mtn Trail #1433. Lower areas of the trail burned in the Pyramid Fire 2012. Use caution when traveling through areas of burned trees and snags. Good river grade trail for 7 miles. There are several small snow slide meadows with horse feed above mile post 4.
Entiat River	1400	The trail is temporarily closed due to hazards resulting from the Wolverine Fire.
Fern Lake	1436	The trail was not maintained in 2016. Fern Lake Trail begins at North Fork Entiat Trail #1437 and ends at Fern Lake. Very steep trail to Fern Lake with limited camping available at lake. Always camp 200' from water. This is a hiker only trail. Livestock is not permitted.
Four Mile	1445	The trail was not maintained in 2016. The Four Mile Ridge Trail begins at Lake Creek Trail #1443 and ends at Devils Backbone Trail #1448. This trail is steep, rocky, and rated most difficult for motorcycles. Great views of the Entiat Valley.
Garland Peak	1408	The trail was maintained in 2016. The Garland Peak Trail begins from Shetipo Trail #1429 and enters Glacier Peak Wilderness to end at its junction with Larch Lakes Trail #1430. This is a primitive ridge trail with some steep and rocky segments but offers great scenery along the entire route. Trail is dry most of the summer, bring water. Tread may be faint in some areas. Not recommended for stock.
Hi Yu	1403	The trail was not maintained in 2016. The Hi Yu Trail begins at Mad River Trail #1409.1 and ends at Lost Lake Trail #1421. This trail is not maintained and not recommended for motorized use. The trail runs along a ridge from Mad River to Lost Lake and is hard to follow in some places. Be aware there are some rocky, hazardous places, including a 6-foot drop. NOT recommended for motorbikes.
Hunters Trail	1417	The trail was maintained in 2016. Hunters Trail begins at Tyee Ridge Trail #1415 and ends at Middle Tommy Trail #1424. This trail provides a loop trip via the Middle Tommy, Blue Creek and Tyee Ridge Trails. The area a quarter mile on each side of the trail is closed to off trail travel by mountain bikes and motorbikes.
Ice Creek	1405	The trail was not maintained in 2016. Ice Creek Trail begins within Glacier Peak Wilderness from Entiat River Trail #1400 west of Borealis Peak and ends at Ice Camp. Trail goes through a glacial-carved valley leading to the approach to Ice Lakes and Mt. Maude. There is no bridge over the Entiat River but it is possible to ford the river when water levels are low. Visitors to the trail will enjoy spectacular mountain scenery with waterfalls and snowfields on both sides of the valley. There are several campsites along the trail in the meadows where horse feed is available.
Ice Lakes	1405.1	The trail was not maintained in 2016. Ice Lakes Trail within Glacier Peak Wilderness begins at the end of Ice Creek Trail #1405 and ends at Upper Ice Lakes, trail is very steep and hard to follow in areas. It is a very steep route that has a 2,000-foot elevation gain from Ice Camp to the upper lake. Leave No Trace: No camping on peninsula on Lower Ice Lake. If camping at Ice Lakes please camp at least 200' away from the lakeshore. No campfires are allowed.
Jimmy Creek	1419	The trail was not maintained in 2016. Jimmy Creek Trail begins at Cougar Ridge Trail #1418 and ends at Upper Mad River Trail #1409.1. This trail is very steep, not maintained and not recommended for motorized use. The trail offers access from Mad River to Cougar Ridge and is primarily used by hunters. This trail is seldom maintained.
Klone Peak	1427	The trail was maintained inn 2016. Klone Peak Trail begins at North Tommy Trail #1425 or Blue Creek Trail #1426 and ends at the viewpoint on summit of Klone Peak. This is a short spur trail. The trail was maintained in 2016. The trail provides a loop opportunity with Angle Peak, Devils
Lake Creek	1443	Backbone and Four Mile Ridge Trails. It starts from Lake Creek Trailhead on Entiat Valley Road #5100 and ends at Devils Backbone Trail #1448. Rated MORE DIFFICULT for motorbikes.
Larch Lakes	1430	The trail is temporarily closed due to hazards resulting from the Wolverine Fire.
Larch Lakes Spur	1430A	The trail is temporarily closed due to hazards resulting from the Wolverine Fire.

Minnow Ridge	1524	The trail was maintained in 2016. This scenic ridge top trail is maintained primarily for motorcycles and mountain bikes. It is rated as an easy ride. The ends at the junction of the Chikamin Creek ORV Trail #1534 and the Chikamin Tie ORV Trail #1561.

North Tommy	1425	The trail was maintained in 2016. North Tommy Trail begins at the end of Forest Service Road #5605 and ends at Blue Creek Trail #1426. Offers access to Blue Creek and Mad River area trails. The trail ties into Blue Creek Trail #1426 which has a seasonal closure to motorbikes, mountain bikes and horses.
Pomas Creek	1453	The trail was not maintained in 2016. The Pomas Creek Trail within Glacier Peak Wilderness begins at Ice Creek Trail #1405 and ends at Larch Lakes Trail #1430. The first mile of the trail is very steep. Trail not recommended for stock, areas of narrow rocky tread with very steep side hill.

It takes off from Pot Peak Trailhead near Snowberry Campground and maintains a narrow tread along the Pot Peak Ridge.
Pugh Ridge	1438	The trail was not maintained in 2016. This steep trail goes from North Fork Trail #1437 to Pyramid Mountain Trail #1433 and accesses Pugh Ridge. There are several grassy meadows along the ridge top. Used mostly by hunters. Areas of the trail burned in the Pyramid Fire in 2012. Use caution when traveling through areas of burned trees and snags.
Pyramid Mountain	1433	The trail was maintained in 2016. This is a scenic high elevation trail. Horse feed and water are available along most of the entire route. There is a steep segment from Pyramid Viewpoint Trail #1441 to Pyramid Creek Trail #1439. The trail runs from Big Hill Road #5900 to Emerald Park Trail #1230.1 within Glacier Peak Wilderness. Rated MORE DIFFICULT for pack and saddle stock.
Pyramid Creek	1439	The trail was maintained in 2016. Trail provides easy access to the alpine areas at the head of Pyramid Creek and Pyramid Mountain Trail. There are several meadows with horse feed in the upper 2 miles. Rated EASY for pack and saddle stock. Lower areas of the trail burned in the Pyramid Fire in 2012. Use caution when traveling through areas of burned trees and snags.
Pyramid Viewpoint	1441	The trail was maintained in 2016. This trail offers a side trip from Pyramid Mountain Trail #1433 to the summit of Pyramid Mountain via the old lookout trail. The elevation at summit is 8,247 feet and offers a spectacular view.
Shetipo	1429	The trail was not maintained in 2016. The Shetipo Trail begins at Cottonwood Campground and ends at the junction of Upper Mad River Trail #1409.1 and Garland Peak Trail #1408. Trail is steep and not recommended for motorcycles. Trail is seldom maintained.
Silver Falls National Recreation Trail	1442	The trail was maintained in 2016. This is a popular day hike. The Silver Falls National Recreation Trail is a loop trail that begins at Forest Service Road 5100 at the trailhead across from Silver Falls Campground. This 1.5 mile loop provides close up views of Silver Falls. From Highway 97A in Entiat, turn west on Entiat River Road and travel 30 miles to trailhead.

Several loop trips can be made via other trails. This trail ties into the Upper Mad River Trail #1409.1 which is a seasonal closure trail.
Wilson Creek	1231.1	The trail is temporarily closed due to hazards resulting from the Wolverine Fire.

OFFICE HOURS: Open Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

WEATHER: A local weather forecast is available at http://go.usa.gov/f4y. There is snow accumulating above 4,000 feet elevation.

SNOW: Snow is accumulating at higher elevations, with 12 inches at Rainy Pass at 4,800 feet elevation, 34 inches reported at Washington Pass at 5,500 feet elevation and 29 inches at Hart's Pass above 6,200 feet elevation.

GROOMED SNOWMOBILE TRAILS: Each year from December 1 to April 1 most Methow Valley Ranger District access roads become groomed snowmobile routes and are closed to wheeled vehicles. Only snowmobiles can be driven on groomed snowmobile routes. A snowmobile is a track driven, **ski steered** vehicle less than 50 inches over-all width. Horses, ATVs and bicycles are not allowed on groomed snowmobile routes. A snow cat use requires a permit to operate on groomed snowmobile routes. Fat bikes are not allowed on groomed snowmobile routes.

NORTH CASCADES HIGHWAY 20 is closed for the winter from milepost 134 to milepost 171 at the Silver Star Gate.

<u>CHRISTMAS TREE PERMITS</u> are sold in Winthrop at Methow Valley Ranger District office, Pardner's Mini-Mart and Winthrop Mountain Sports. They are also available at Hank's Market and Hank's Mini-Mart in Twisp.

SNO-PARK PERMITS: Sno-park permits are available for purchase at the Methow Valley Ranger District Office.

ROADS: Snow is accumulating above 4,000 feet elevation. Each year from December 1 to April 1 most Methow Valley Ranger District access roads become groomed snowmobile routes and are closed to wheeled vehicles.

On November 15 some district roads became groomed cross-country ski routes closed to wheeled vehicles and snowmobiles.

Check for current conditions and closures before you go. The best way to be prepared is to think ahead about what you would do in a potential emergency situation and have proper equipment and supplies with you. Many forest roads close October 1 for use as non-motorized hunting areas.

WOODCUTTING: Firewood cutting permits are available for purchase at the Methow Valley Ranger District office and at Pardner's Mini-Mart in Winthrop. In Twisp, permits may be purchased at Twisp Chevron, Hank's, Hank's Mini Mart, and in Carlton at the Carlton Store. Most Forest Service access roads become groomed snowmobile routes, closed to wheeled vehicles December 1 through April 1, limiting access to roads for firewood cutting.

<u>CAMPGROUNDS:</u> Campgrounds have no potable water or garbage dumpsters so remember to bring drinking water and pack out all garbage. Campground water systems are drained and turned off for the season. Access to Hart's Pass, Meadows, and Lone Fir Campgrounds is blocked due to snow accumulation.

US Customs and Border Protection requires that U.S. citizens returning home from Canada by land or sea present one of the travel documents listed at a US Port of Entry: U.S. Passport, U.S. Passport Card, Enhanced Driver's License, Trusted Traveler Program Cards. This cannot be done at the international PCT crossing.

NO THROUGH ACCESS ALLOWED AT THE RANGER STATION IN LEAVENWORTH: There is no public access through the ranger station compound, all gates are locked because of safety issues and vandalism.

SNOW/WEATHER: Snow levels are now dropping to between 3,000-4,000 feet elevation, bringing winter-like conditions to many ranger district roads, trails and trailheads. Go to www.NOAA.gov for current weather conditions; use zip code **98826** for conditions in the Leavenworth and Lake Wenatchee areas. Remember, weather conditions can change quickly.

BUCK CREEK/SAUL WILDFIRE CLOSURES: Fire closures remain in effect for the Buck Creek Fire. This includes the Buck Creek Trail No. 1513 and Chiwawa River Trail No. 1550. These trails will remain closed to public access until trail crews can clear them of hazards next spring.

CAMPGROUNDS: Campgrounds in the Icicle River drainage, except for Chatter Creek Campground, are closed but accessible on a non-fee basis with no amenities such as water, toilet paper or garbage service. Chatter Creek Campground is closed until further notice due to hazard trees caused by root rot—do not camp in this campground. Forest Service employees are working hard to identify and remove these hazards.

Recreation day use passes cost \$5 per vehicle per day or \$30 for an annual **Northwest Forest Pass.**Passes are available locally at the Wenatchee River Ranger District office, Dan's Market, Leavenworth 76 gas stations on Highway 2 and at Icicle Junction, Der Sportsman, Sleeping Lady Gift Shop, and Pioneer Market in Cashmere. In the Lake Wenatchee area, passes are available Midway Village, Parkside Grocery and Plain Hardware. Interagency Passes are also honored at trailheads and available for purchase at all Ranger Districts.
